

The Careers in Natural Resource Management Fair coincides with one of The University of Montana open houses, called UM Days. These are full-day events that include campus tours, student services presentations, a student panel, residence hall tours, lunch on campus and academic department meetings. The afternoon of UM Days is open time for students and their families to visit prospective colleges/departments and the career fair will be featured as an event that afternoon. The Pro/Am competition is part of Forestry Day and will be held at the Garrett Grothen Arena at Fort Missoula on Saturday, April 27. The day includes collegiate and professional lumberjack competitions, an impressive array of historic forestry and logging equipment, operating steampowered sawmill, restored fire lookout tower, and more. Food and beverages will be available for purchase. Including theBlacksmith Brewing Co. sponsored a beer garden. Admission for Forestry Day is \$3 for adults, \$2 for senior citizens, and \$1 for students; children under 6 are admitted free.

## **Training Update**

The Forestry Scholarship Association has continued to provide quality, applicable training to College of Forestry and Conservation (CFC) students. This fall, the UM Student Chapter of SAF approached the FSA about facilitating a chainsaw training course. The FSA agreed that this was a perfect opportunity help CFC students gain practical experience which will benefit them both professionally and personally.

On March 1-3, the FSA presented the chainsaw training course, S-212 "Wildland Fire Chainsaws". This course was offered free of charge and provided students with a solid foundation in chainsaw operation. While the class focused on the wildland fire environment, the skills covered are applicable to anyone who may be operating a chainsaw, in both professional and private settings. Course topics included chainsaw safety, operation, field maintenance, troubleshooting, and fireline construction. In addition to classroom instruction, the students also spent a full day in the field at Lubrecht Experimental Forest. The field day provided mentored, hands-on cutting which supports entry level training for sawyers with little or no previous experience in operating a chainsaw. All students who successfully completed the training received a NWCG Certificate of Completion. Thank you to all students for your participation throughout the weekend.

The cadre of instructors for this class was outstanding, made up of FSA members and

supporters who are qualified sawyers with a broad range of experience. Thank you to course instructors Alex Williams, Rich Blaney, Travis Parker, Jeremy Harker, Cory Calnan, Jake Besmer, Ted Adams, and Matt DeLaney for donating your time to put on a great class!
